I use organizing a reference list when . . .
I share my work with others.



When I organize a reference list, I . . .

- identify all the sources I used in my inquiry.
- determine if the source is a book, eBook, website, or video.
- record the author name, title, publisher, year of publication, and the URL (if the source is online) for each of my sources.
- Record “no author,” “no date,” “no publisher,” or “no date” if a piece of information is not available.
